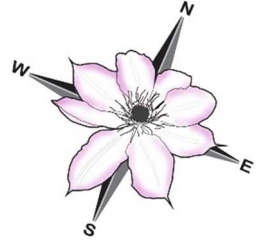

Many thanks to our Seed Exchange Administrators, Mike Miller (USA), Ingrid Kastell (EU-Sweden) and Guy Opie (UK). If you live outside these 3 Areas and would like to order some seed, please find out what the rules are for importing seed into your country and contact Mike Miller (mjmil@comcast.net). Last year we successfully exported seed to members in Canada and Japan.

How to Order Seed:

Please email requests for seeds to Mike Miller by **January 1, 2024** at mjmil@comcast.net, putting **SEED EXCHANGE** in the subject line.

For those without email Mike's address is: 419 Gregory Avenue, Wilmette, IL 60091, USA.

Orders are filled in order of arrival with donors processed first. Members may request 10 seed lots in their first request so that all members have a chance to request small lots of desired seed. If more than 10 seed lots are desired, members should include those as well in their email. If enough seed is available when the Seed Exchange closes January 1, those seed lots will go out to the Member in the same initial shipment.

Include your name and address and list the seed lots in order of preference by their number from the list below (USA1, UK1, etc.) and number your seed requests in your preferred order. For example:

- 1) UK44, *C. urticifolia*
- 2) USA39, *C. reticulata*

After January 1 Mike will assemble all the seed requests and work out which seeds will be sent between the different Areas. The seeds will be sent in one batch between the different Areas to minimise the paperwork and inspection costs. The process of transferring seeds between the UK and the EU took some time last year but now that we understand the process better it will go much more quickly.

Seed List Table Key

No. = unique identifier for ordering seed

Area of origin = seed collected and held in either UK or USA

Name = parent plant as submitted by Donor

Pollination information = OP is short for Open Pollinated; Open pollinated species in gardens will not necessarily yield pure species seed! So a *C. reticulata* seed from a garden setting could have been pollinated by a different species' pollen and the result will be a hybrid rather than the true species.

FRCC = The Friends of the Rogerson Clematis Collection
